Daily Care

Protective Measures

While Gen Stone has high heat resistance, sudden temperature changes can cause damage. Always use a chopping board or heat trivet when placing hot pots, pans, or oven trays on your surface.

Prevent scratches by using a chopping board when cutting food. This protects both your kitchen knives and the surface from damage.

Cleaning products with extreme pH levels can deteriorate the surface over time. Refrain from using high or low pH cleaning agents.

Matte & Honed Finishes: These finishes may require slightly more effort to clean compared to polished surfaces.



What to Avoid



Avoid harsh chemicals, excessive weight, and abrasive cleaners to protect your Gen Stone surface.

Harmful Substances



Harsh Chemicals

Avoid exposure to paint strippers, paint removers, bleach, and nail polish remover. If accidental contact occurs, rinse immediately with clean water and follow standard cleaning procedures.



Excessive Weight

Avoid placing heavy loads on the surface, such as standing on it for tasks like painting or electrical work.



Abrasive & Wax

Never use abrasive sponges, steel wool, or harsh cleaners, as they can scratch or damage the surface. Avoid detergents with wax or polishing additives that may leave an oily residue.
